# **Rest Easy- External Review.**

Since 2020, we have implemented a whole school approach to mental health called 'Rest Easy'. This is something that our children and staff have embraced and we have found that many of our children have benefited from the method and will now independently apply the strategies to support them when they are feeling sad, angry or unsettled. Mrs Hadley has worked with small groups of children, who have been identified by staff, to provide additional Rest Easy intervention. This has also been very successful and has enabled us to provide more targeted support for individual pupils.

Last week, Emily Gearing (founder of Rest Easy) came into school to complete an external review. We are delighted with the outcome and have now been awarded the silver Rest Easy award. This is a wonderful achievement for the school and I am incredibly grateful to all the staff who have embraced Rest Easy and built Rest Easy time into the daily timetable as well as Miss Hudson and Mrs Hadley who have been critical in ensuring the success of the implementation of the approach across the school. We have now been invited to be a flagship school for Rest Easy and look forward to sharing our practice with other schools. Next year, we will be working towards the Gold accreditation and will be involving parents as part of this. Further details will be shared in the autumn term.

# **Summer Reading Challenge:**



The summer reading challenge is taking place at Wirral libraries over the summer holiday. Last year, at Wirral libraries, 2731 children joined the challenge and we would love to have lots of Gayton children taking part this year. Children can sign up at their local library or online.

It is proven that the Summer reading challenge helps to significantly improve reading confidence and independence. It helps to ensure that pupils are ready for their return to school, preventing the summer reading 'dip' and reading supports your child in accessing the wider curriculum.

- Children sign up through their local library and receive a collector folder.
- They set a reading goal and borrow books of their choice during the summer, collecting special stickers and incentives.
- Library staff and volunteers help children to discover new books that suit their interests and reading level and run a programme of free themed activities in the library.
- Children who complete the Challenge are presented with a certificate and a medal.

We will be having a special competition in school this year to mark the Summer Reading challenge and for every child who completes the summer reading challenge and brings their certificate into school, they will be entered into a prize draw to win some book tokens. We will choose a winner from F2/KS1 & KS2.

Reading is such an important life skill and we know that it is proven that children who do not read regularly are at a significant disadvantage to those that do and may find their learning more difficult as a result.
