Dear Parents & Carers,

Children in Need. We are delighted to announce that we raised **£373.90** for Children in Need. Huge thanks to our families for supporting this wonderful cause and for helping us to raise so much money. Cyclists:

As an Eco-school, we actively encourage pupils to cycle to school as long as parents are able to supervise them safely or they have completed their Bike Right cycle proficiency which teaches children how to cycle safely on the road. However, please can I ask that all car drivers take extra care when overtaking cyclists. Within the Highway Code, it clearly states that cyclists should be given as least as much room as you would when overtaking a car. Many of the roads around school are not wide enough to facilitate this which means that drivers should not be overtaking cyclists at all.



Rule 163 from the Highway Code: Give vulnerable road users at least as much space as you would a car.

Remote Learning (Y1-Y6)

If your child is isolating at home, there will be a first day response home learning sheet for children to complete for Years 1-6 this will be accessed via Google Classroom. From day 2, staff will then individually assign the work to your child via Google Classroom so that it can be completed at home. This work will be fully aligned to our curriculum. Teachers will post the work for your child and they can submit their work for marking/feedback via Google Classroom. The school office



will also email you the link for celebration assembly which is held on a Friday so that your child can be part of the assembly.

Remote Learning (F2)

For F2 pupils, Mrs Such will upload activities via Tapestry for your child to complete at home.

Please note that this work is only to be completed by children who are isolating due to COVID- 19. We will not provide work for children who are absent as they are ill as they should be resting and not completing school work.

EdShed Resources:

In order to supplement our remote learning opportunities for pupils, we have purchased Maths Shed and Spelling Shed for Years 1-6. Your child will shortly be provided with the details for them to access the resources and these will be utilised to complement our homework and remote learning resources.

Neo- Community Centre- Child poverty charity work



We have partnered with the Neo Community charity who provide invaluable support to so many families in need on the Wirral. We are going to be supporting their campaign to ensure that as many children, who are in need on the Wirral, get a Christmas gift to open on Christmas Day. Therefore, the PTA have arranged for a bucket outside school which will be there at drop off and pick up. The bucket has 341 gift tags in it. Each gift

tag will give the details of a child who needs our help. These details will give you enough information to buy a gift for this child at Christmas.

You can purchase a gift and place in a gift bag with a Christmas card that your child can write to the child. Please note that due to COVID-19 restrictions any gifts donated must be new. The children will have a virtual assembly during school with Ema from the Neo Community Centre. She will be able to explain to the children the importance of this campaign and how we can all make a difference this year to other local children. All gift bags will be collected from outside school on **Friday 11**th **December at 9:30am**. It would be wonderful if as many families as possible could take part in this campaign to really make a difference to the lives of some Wirral children at Christmas time.

Kitchen work planned 30th November 2020- 4th December 2020.



Just to remind all parents that our kitchen will be closed from **Monday 30th November-Friday 4th December 2020.** All children will need to bring a packed lunch into school every day this week. This includes all F2, Y1 & Y2 pupils who would normally have universal free school meals. I can only apologise for any inconvenience caused but can assure you that this work is essential and needs to take place as soon as possible due to the amount of water we are losing and the costs to the school associated with this. If

your child qualifies for free school meals, we will be able to provide your child with a packed lunch. We will contact these families separately to confirm that you would like a school packed lunch provided that week. If your child doesn't have a packed lunch box, we will permit paper bags/ plastic bags just for that week but please ensure that this is labelled so it is easily recognisable.
