
During lockdown, our school very successfully utilised Google Classroom and we will be continuing to make use of this platform during this year. It is therefore vital that you have activated your child's Google Classroom account as this will be the main way that we will be sharing homework expectations if your child

is in Years 1- 6. If you have not done so, please can you ensure that you do activate their account. If you don't have your child's login details please contact the school office and they will be able to help you.

Homework expectations F2- Mrs Such will share activities for parents via Tapestry. This system is a wonderful way for parents to be involved in their child's learning journey.

Homework expectations Y1 & Y2

Reading



Your child should be reading daily to an adult. This year we are not giving out reading records for children in Years 1-6. Therefore each child has been assigned an electronic reading record on Google Classroom. We would like you to complete this at home and then school staff will be able to view this in school.

Y1 only- Miss Nederlof has selected some English activities for your child to complete. These will be shared on Google Classroom.

Y2 only- Your child will be set a reading comprehension to complete on a fortnightly basis.

Answers will be provided for you to discuss with your child.

Phonics/ Spellings & Handwriting.



Spelling/phonics:

Your child will be given spellings to learn on a Friday via Google Classroom.

These spellings should be rehearsed and practised a minimum of 5 times a week. Your child will be tested on these spellings on a Friday in class.

Handwriting:

We follow the letter join scheme as a school. Your child can log in to our school account and practise individual letters or joins to support them with developing their handwriting.

Mathematics




On Google Classroom your child will be given an overview of different maths activities. Your child should select an activity to complete each week.

They can either complete the work as a google document or they can complete on paper and you can upload a photograph of their work to the classroom.

Your child should be reading daily to an adult. This year we are not giving out reading records for children in Years 1-6. Therefore each child has been assigned an electronic reading record on Google Classroom. We would like you to complete this at home and then school staff will be able to view this in school.

In addition your child will be set a reading comprehension weekly on Google Classroom. This will be discussed in class before the children complete it at home. Answers will be provided and it can be marked at home.

Your child will be given spellings to learn on a Friday via Google Classroom.

These spellings should be rehearsed and practised a minimum of 3 times a week. Your child will be tested on these spellings on a Friday in class.

Handwriting:

We follow the letter join scheme as a school. Your child can log in to our school account and practise individual letters or joins to support them with developing their handwriting.

Times table Rockstars-

Your child should be accessing Times table Rockstars at least 3 times a week. This site helps them to practise and reinforce multiplication tables and corresponding division facts which are so important for developing their fluency.

Your child should have their own username and password in order to access the site.

Maths activity:

Your child will be given a Maths text book and will be asked to complete activities within the book. This will be used to consolidate class work.

Your child will be told on a weekly basis which pages they need to complete within the book. The book will now remain at home but answers will be provided for parents. If your child is really struggling with something, please just email the school office and this will be passed onto the class teacher so that they are aware.

Sound System Fundraising:

The PTA are currently raising money for a brand new sound system for school. This is desperately needed as our current system really is not working and we are having problems with it daily. Due to COVID-19, we have had to rearrange our lunchtimes so that bubbles can't mix and the children now spend 30 minutes in the dinner hall at lunchtime. To keep them entertained we have been trying to put on some things to watch during this time, but unfortunately the technology is not facilitating this and most days the children end up watching things in silence! Please if you are able to give anything to support the PTA in raising the money for a new sound system it would be very much appreciated by all the school staff and our children. COVID- 19 updates:

As you will be aware, cases of coronavirus are rapidly increasing on the Wirral. It is vital that everyone plays their part in trying to reduce the community transmission.

From *Monday 14th September* it is important that families do not meet socially in groups of more than 6 people. These measures are being put in place in order to try and prevent a localised lockdown.

If your child is displaying any of the following symptoms: A high temperature; a new continuous cough; or



the loss or change of their sense of taste or smell. It is vital that you do not send your child to school and that you take your child to a test centre to be tested.

If your child develops any of these symptoms in school, we will contact you immediately and ask you to come and collect your child. Any siblings will also be sent home. Your child/ren can return to school if the result is negative, provided they feel well and they have not had a fever for 48 hours.

Tests can be arranged by calling 119 or visiting the NHS website.

If school does have confirmed positive cases, these will be reported to Public Health and the local authority. They will then support school in making appropriate decisions regarding who the close contacts are in relation to the pupil or staff member. Any close contacts will be instructed to self-isolate immediately for 14 days (as per national guidance). If your child is identified as a close contact to a confirmed positive case they will not be allowed to return to school until after the 14 days even if they are tested and they receive a negative result.

Home – learning whilst self- isolating.

If your child is self-isolating due to waiting for test results or because your child is identified as a close contact, we will provide work for your child via Google Classroom.
