For the third year after the introduction of the new assessment framework, we have seen a rise in children attaining the expected and higher 'Greater Depth' standard, which is pleasing.

' 0 ' is progress in line with expectations. The school progress score is calculated by averaging all the progress scores of everychild in each subject and comparingthis to the 'in line'marker. Therefore, in reading andmaths, we were a tiny percentage under expected progress overall and in writing (explained above) further below but again, these figures have been improving year-on-year since the new framework introduction. The progress is calculated by lookingatchildren's KS1 scores inyear2andcomparing thistotheirscore in Year6under thenew framework. A significantnumberofourchildrenattainedvery highly atKS1 andtherefore theprogress measure becomes very challenging for us to attain positive figures in, under the new framework, despite pleasing results at higher levels in reading, maths and grammar and punctuation (see below).
