Values-based education work

We are developing this further this half term, through the theme of 'Respect and tolerance' This will be emphasised in each class and in assemblies and PSHCE work during anti-bullying week (12-16 November) so look out for tweets showing the work we have been doing! We continue to emphasise the first half term's 'Happiness' theme, exploring this through assemblies, PSHCE, drama and underpinning other curriculum work. The term so far has had a lovely collegiate feel, with children being more aware of each others' needs and staff working closely together. Our play leaders have been superb this term, helping children to organise games and to distribute equipment for use.
