Dear Parents & Carers,

Bubble closures:

Many thanks to all our parents for your unwavering support during our recent bubble closures. I am so sorry for all the inconvenience caused and appreciate how challenging this period is for parents. We have had a number of classes closing in order to isolate and a number of staff isolating as a result of this. Many thanks to everyone who has had to endure periods of isolation and the associated frustrations this causes.

Once again, I would like to thank staff for reverting to online learning via Google Classroom and trying to keep some sense of normality for the children whilst they have been isolating at home. Our children, yet again, have been completely wonderful and constantly amaze me with their resilience and ability to adapt and accept the current circumstances. This is certainly not how we wanted the end of the year to work out for our children or staff, but all we can do at the moment is follow the guidelines that are in place for schools and hope that we do not have any further cases.

Covid 19 & plans for the school return in September:

From September, there will be some changes for schools in relation to covid-19. Schools will be expected to still have a covid-19 risk assessment in place and this will be shared with the whole school community.



- *Bubbles will not be in place.
- *Our children will be able to play and interact with each other from F2- Year 6 (we are so excited for this change as we know how much our children have missed interacting with each other).
- *Face to face assemblies will resume.
- *Enhanced cleaning will remain in place.
- *Ventilation within the school environment will still be a high priority- windows will remain open.
- *Children will still use hand sanitiser/hand washing will remain.
- *School will no longer be responsible for contact tracing. Close contacts will now be identified by Test and Trace.
- *From 16th August 2021, children under the age of 18 years old will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case. Instead, the close contact will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test.

September dropping off and pick up timings:

We will be keeping the staggered starts in the morning so you will be able to drop off your child from **8:40am- 8:50am**. However, we will only be using two gates and will not be using the car park entrance.

KS2 children will enter via the junior gate on the playground and will go straight into school. KS1 & F2 children will enter via the infant gate on the playground. F2 pupils will go through the Y3/4 door into school and our Y1 and Y2 children will walk around the back of the building into their classrooms.

End of day arrangements:

We will revert to our pre-covid timings.

F2, Y1 & Y2 will finish at 3:20pm & Y3-6 will finish at 3:25pm.

Reports & school work books.

Your child should have brought their school report home with them on Tuesday 13th July 2021. If you wish

to speak to your child's class teacher regarding the report, please contact the school office and the class teacher will arrange a telephone appointment with you. We have included a feedback form within the report and would very much appreciate it if you could return this to school by the end of term.

If your child is in Y5, you can choose to collect your child's report from the office or wait until the Y5 children return to school on Monday 19th July 2021. The NFER results are not in the reports for Year 5 as Mrs Hulley has been isolating so these will be sent home on Monday when Mrs Hulley returns to work.



Your child will be bringing their school book's home on Wednesday 14th July 2021.

Power Maths

From September, we will be implementing a new maths scheme across the school. This scheme is called '*Power Maths'* and has been approved and recommended by the DfE.

This scheme is the only mastery programme which is perfectly aligned to the White Rose Maths scheme that we have previously been using. It is built around a child- centred lesson design that models and embeds a growth mind set approach to maths and focuses on helping all children to build a deep understanding of maths concepts.

All staff will be trained on the inset day in September and then we will be launching the scheme with all our children. During the autumn term, we will be providing an opportunity for parents to find out more about Power Maths.



OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning)

We will be sending out our 1st OPAL newsletter this week in order to update parents with all our exciting recent developments.



From September, we will be asking all parents to send a pair of (labelled) wellies into school with their child. These wellies will remain in school and will ensure that our children can play across the school site (field and playground) throughout the year.



Our F2, Y1 and Y2 children will initially be using the poly-tunnel in order to store and get changed in and out of their wellies. We have added benches in there so it is a


perfect space for the children.

We are currently researching options for KS2 welly storage and will update parents with our plans in due course. We will be asking the PTA to support us in fund raising for our longer term welly storage options.

Summer Reading Challenge-

The summer reading challenge has launched. It would be lovely to see some of our children joining in with the challenge. This year the theme is 'Wild World Heroes' and is a celebration of nature and action for the environment, in partnership with WWF, UK.





Alternatively, the children can go into the library and they will be able to pick up their collector's wallet.

Message from Merseyside Police – Private E-scooters: Illegal and Dangerous for children.

Trauma surgeons recently met with Merseyside Police at The Merseyside Road Safety Partnership to tell us about the increasing number of life changing injuries they are seeing after e-scooter collisions.

Lots of sellers hide the fact that **ANY** e-scooter you can buy is illegal to use (except on private land), and police regularly seize them. The orange ones you might see around Liverpool are part of a government pilot scheme and are illegal for under 17s. You have to have at least a provisional driving licence to use one.

We know that e-scooters look fun, but they aren't legal or safe for children.
