We are providing weekly maths worksheets which can be collected from school on Friday for the following week. This means that parents do not need to print anything for maths. We completely appreciate that our online learning does require screen time for pupils. This is completely unavoidable at the current time. Staff are providing independent activities as well as the Google Meet sessions and some activities will not require use of the computer. This is why it is all so important that children have their scheduled breaks and lunchtimes without screen time so that they are having some time away from the computer during the school day. For a variety of reasons, not all children can complete their independent work within the session and this can cause stress for the children. All children are different and we know your child and what they are capable of. We completely understand that at times your child may not complete all the work in the time available. This is absolutely fine. Please don't put additional pressure on your child during these challenging times, as long as they are trying their best that is all that matters. Work can still be submitted partially completed or can be submitted later when they have finished it. If you are concerned that your child's class teacher as they will be able to advise you regarding this. Have systems for distributing online reading books to the children.
