Letter Join- Handwriting scheme home access

Letter-join∮ From this week, we are going to be sending home via email the login details for our letter join scheme. This will enable children to continue to practise their handwriting at home and will enable parents to see how the children should be forming and joining particular letters. There is no doubt that there has been a significant improvement with regards to the standards of presentation and handwriting within school over the last few weeks, but it is still early days in regards to the implementation of the scheme so please do encourage your child to practise at home.

Please note that I am unable to upload these details to our website as the resources are only for the pupils of our school to access so please do ensure that you don't share this with anyone else. This information will be sent home via email for parents.

Spelling scores

Following feedback from parents, we have implemented a way for your child's spelling score to be shared with you every week so that you know how they have performed in their spelling test on a Friday. This will enable parents to monitor how your child is performing as well as work on the spellings that they have struggled with.

In KS2 (Y3-6) this will be shared via a sheet which has been stuck in your child's maths homework book. Your child will be responsible for updating the sheet on a Friday once they have completed their spelling test. Please ensure that your child's maths homework book is in school on Friday so that they can complete the sheet otherwise we won't be able to share the test result with you.

In Y2 your child will be given a certificate with their score on and a list of any spellings that they got incorrect. In Y1 the children will be bringing home their red spelling book so that you can see the spelling test result. Please ensure that this red book is returned to school on Friday so that the results can be shared with you.
