We will be donating to other charity work across the year, but this will be our main charity for birthday donations. If you would like to make a donation, please do so via Parent Pay. We will be regularly updating parents with regards to how much we have raised for our charity.

Attendance and Punctuality:

Our school now has an allocated attendance officer who is working with all West Wirral schools. I will be contacting all families where attendance has been a concern (in the previous academic year) to ensure that we can work together to improve your child's attendance.

Last year, our whole school attendance was 96.3%. We are aiming as a school to try and improve attendance to reach 97% this year. Whilst this will be challenging, it is important to recognise how everyone can play a part in us ensuring that we strive to achieve this. In assemblies we will be recognising the children who achieve 100% attendance for a term as well as those who achieve 97%+.

I will also be contacting families where punctuality is an issue. It is vital that your child is in school every day on time so that they don't miss out on valuable learning time. Please do try to make sure that your child is ready to come in via the school gates at 8:50am.

Please remember that term times holidays will not be authorised unless they are due to exceptional circumstances.
