# Newsletter 8- 5.11.19

Dear Parents & Carers,

A very warm welcome back to everyone following the half term holiday! We certainly had a very busy first half term and are looking forward to an equally busy (possibly busier) second half term!

#### **School Improvement:**



I just wanted to provide an overview of some of the things that we have been working on in the last half term so that parents are aware of some of the key school improvement aspects. This is not a definitive list but provides a snapshot of some of the things that we have been developing:

- Reviewing the teaching of guided reading across the school to ensure consistency with regards to the structure and implementation.
- Training for teaching staff with regards to providing high quality guided reading sessions.
- Monitoring the quality of writing that is being completed across the school and ensuring that staff are utilising high quality model texts.
- Miss Nederlof had the opportunity to attend a phonics course specifically focusing on supporting Y1 children with passing the phonics screening test.
- Introduction of 'magpie' books to facilitate developing children's vocabulary across Years 2-6.
- Implementing and embedding a new handwriting scheme across the school and launching home access as part of this.
- Introduction of a presentation policy across the school to ensure high expectations with regards to presentation and the quality of work that children are producing.
- Introduction of an electronic system for recording safeguarding & pastoral/behavioural aspects. Ensuring that appropriate information is recorded and shared with the key people in school.
- Introduction of 'Picture News' from Years 1- 6 to enable pupils to debate national and global issues and to further embed the teaching of British values.
- Curriculum development- Mrs Hulley, Mrs Such and Miss Nederlof have all had the opportunity to work alongside a consultant to start thinking about how we are going to start re-designing our new curriculum to meet the needs of all the children at Gayton. This will be a significant aspect of school development over the next year, and beyond, as we focus on ensuring that we build a curriculum which is coherently planned and progressive with regards to knowledge and skill development.

Many thanks to everyone for coming along to parents' evening. We have been delighted to have received so much positive feedback over the two days from parents. We hope you found your appointment(s) beneficial and feel that you were provided with useful information regarding how your child has settled into their new class. There will be a reading information session for parents of Y1- Y6 children on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> November 2019. The session will start in the hall at 6:00pm where I will give a short update to parents regarding our school development plan in relation to reading. Then class teachers will lead a presentation based on supporting parents in further understanding how reading is taught across the school. Children are welcome to attend this session but we will expect them to remain with you during this time. They might like to bring their reading book with them to keep them occupied whilst listening to the presentations!

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#### Anti- Bullying week 'Change starts with us'



Next week is anti-bullying week. Across school, the children will be participating in a range of activities to raise the profile of anti-bullying and will be learning about how everyone can make a difference. I am delighted to announce that our Y5 children have been invited to

attend an anti-bullying conference on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> November and they will be performing a short play in front of all the other schools who are attending. This play is being led completely by the Y5 children (with a little bit of guidance from Mrs Hulley) and will make the audience really consider what bullying actually is.

As part of Anti-bullying week, we will be supporting **Odd Sock day on 12<sup>th</sup> November** and would like everyone to come to school wearing odd socks! It's an opportunity for children to express themselves and celebrate their individuality and what makes us all unique!

#### **Poppy Appeal**

We now have the Poppy appeal box in school and pupils can bring money into school to buy items. We have one box of merchandise and one box of Poppies to sell and help raise money for the Royal British Legion.
